



School introduction

The International School of Los Angeles is an international preschool through 12th grade school committed to academic excellence in a nurturing and intimate environment that encourages personal initiative, creativity, and curiosity. All students study a common bilingual program from preschool through 8th grade after which they choose one of two rigorous programs that culminates in the International Baccalaureate® (IB) Diploma or the French *baccalauréat* (FB). With multiple Los Angeles-area campuses (Burbank, Los Feliz, Pasadena, and West Valley), the School welcomes over 1,000 students. Approximately 26% of our total student population receives school-based financial aid.

Since 1978, the School has been instilling the love of learning in all its students through small classes and low student-to-teacher ratios. With over 65 nationalities and 40 spoken languages represented on the campuses, students study and live in a diverse global community every day. **Our goal is to develop confident, caring, and open-minded critical thinkers who will thrive in a diverse, competitive world.**

Regarding the COVID-19 pandemic

Our students returned to in-person instruction in March 2021, after a year of distance-learning. Full in-person learning has continued since then, following health and safety protocols. Official IB and French Bac exams were in place in May/June of 2022; however, students still contended with cancellations for standardized testing SAT and ACT exams.

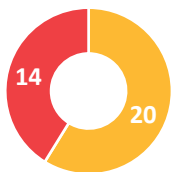

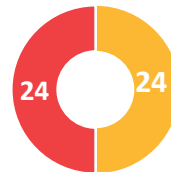

Accreditations

The School holds accreditation from the French Ministry of Education, the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC), the California Association of Independent Schools (CAIS), and the International Baccalaureate® (IB) and is a member of the NAIS and the National Honor Society (NHS).



Distinctive curricular features

All students fulfill the UC A-G requirements for high school graduation and university entrance.

9th & 10th grade:

Students choose either the International track or the French track for 9th and 10th grades, giving them the opportunity to enroll in rigorous and diverse coursework that culminates in one of two credentials: the International Baccalaureate® Diploma or the French *baccalauréat*. All students in the French track take the *diplôme national du brevet* examination at the end of 9th grade, and students in both the International and French tracks take AP French Language & Culture in 10th grade.

11th & 12th grade:

Students formally apply to, and enroll in, either the **International Baccalaureate® Diploma Programme** or the **French *baccalauréat*** program including the **OIB** (*option internationale du baccalauréat*), which is now in its final year. Both choices provide rigorous, academically demanding, and well-balanced courses of study. Shared elements include multiple-language study, a minimum of one advanced laboratory science class, challenging philosophy courses, and the completion of university-level research work and writing.

International Baccalaureate® Diploma Programme (IB®)

All IB® students are entered as Diploma candidates when they begin the program and many ultimately receive the **Bilingual IB® Diploma** for studying in two languages at a literature (not language-acquisition) level. Students who join us in 11th grade to begin the two-year program do not need to speak French but must possess a degree of bilingualism in a second language by the time they graduate (see courses below). Our Standard Level (SL) courses are timetabled for three hours per week, while Higher Level (HL) courses are timetabled for five. Some students choose to enroll in four Higher Level subjects, if approved to do so by faculty. The IB® schedule includes two hours of Theory of Knowledge, a certain number of CAS (Creativity, Action, Service) hours as well as several Independent Learning Center hours per week, allowing students to balance their homework and extracurricular life. Higher Level subjects as well as some Standard Level subjects are automatically given Honors acknowledgement by the UC A-G system.

IB® course offerings:

All courses for the Diploma are taken in 11th and 12th grades and, other than languages, are taught in English and are offered at Higher Level (HL) or Standard Level (SL). Theory of Knowledge is taken two hours a week for two years.

Group 1: Language A Literature in English and Language A Literature & Language in French (HL & SL)

Group 2: Language B (Language Acquisition) in Spanish and French

Other languages may be offered as Language B on a case-by-case basis.

Many students select Language A Literature & Language in French in Group 2, earning a bilingual diploma.

Group 3: Individuals and Societies: History (HL & SL)

Group 4: Experimental Sciences: Biology (HL & SL), Physics (HL & SL), Chemistry (HL & SL), Environmental Systems (SL)

Group 5: Mathematics Analysis & Approaches (HL & SL), Mathematics Applications & Interpretations (HL & SL)

Group 6: Arts & Electives: Visual Arts (HL & SL), Music (HL & SL)

Other courses available on Pamoja (online learning platform): Economics (HL & SL), Business & Management (HL & SL), Psychology (HL & SL), Philosophy (HL & SL), ITGS (HL & SL), Film (SL)

French *baccalauréat* (FB) - Class of 2022

The revised French *baccalauréat* produced its first graduating class in 2021. In this program, students must study core subjects as well as options and *spécialités* (majors), as detailed below:

French *baccalauréat* core curriculum:

- > **11th grade:** Honors French Literature & Culture*, History/Geography, Languages (English Literature and Composition and Spanish), Experimental Sciences
- > **12th grade:** Honors Philosophy*, History/Geography, Languages (English Literature and Composition and Spanish), Experimental Sciences

Spécialités/Majors (all given Honors recognition in the UC A-G system):

- > **11th grade (3 selections taught 3 times a week for a total of 4 hours each):** Cinematic Arts, Biology, Mathematics, Physics/Chemistry, Social Sciences (Economics)
- > **12th grade (2 selections remain from the above, taught 2 times a week for a total of 6 hours each)**

Options:

- > **An optional course can be added for 12th grade, adding 3 hours to the student's timetable. The options are:** Advanced Honors Calculus*, Honors Global Issues*, Complementary Mathematics

OIB - *option internationale du baccalauréat* (in its final graduating year of 2022– to be replaced by the *BFI – Baccalauréat français international* in 2023)

The OIB is a two-year curriculum option that exists within the framework of the French *baccalauréat*. This option adds 5 hours a week to a student's timetable, and includes the following courses:

- > **11th grade:** AP English Literature & Composition, Honors European History* (taught both in English and French)
- > **12th grade:** Honors World Literature*, Honors European History* (taught both in English and French)

*These French *baccalauréat* classes are given Honors recognition in the UC A-G system, which is also the case for all *spécialités/majors* courses.

Academic results

100% Pass rate for French *baccalauréat* students, with **79%** earning **Honors**.

95% Pass rate for IB[®] Diploma students (compared to 86% pass rate for Northern Hemisphere), with **44%** obtaining the **bilingual diploma** (compared to 28% for Northern Hemisphere). The class mean of **32.3/45** was slightly **higher than the world mean** of 31.98.

Ranking, assessment, and GPA calculation

The School does not rank its students, because of small cohorts that are separated out by Diploma choices. FB students are traditionally graded on a 20-point scale, while IB[®] students are graded on the IB[®] 7-point scale; these two systems are then translated into an American A-F scale as well as a GPA as per the table below. Students are considered to be failing if they have reached a D+ equivalency. The School's GPA calculations range from 4.3-5.3. Weighted GPA points are assigned to Higher Level and UC A-G approved Honors courses.

Standardized and other test scores (Class of 2022)

The majority of students did not take SAT or ACT tests during their final academic year. Although beyond our formal curriculum, 78 students, of their own volition, participated in 148 AP exams in 2022, resulting in 14 AP Scholars, 2 AP Scholars with Honors, 3 AP Scholars with Distinction.

Student life

We returned to in-person clubs during the 2021-2022 academic year.

Clubs:

Despite residing in widespread areas of Los Angeles, our students are passionately involved in many meaningful extra-curriculars, including a competitive Model United Nations (MUN), high-school Debate Team, Gender & Sexuality Alliance, Minority Student Union, Justice Committee, Film Club and a recently revived Girl-Up Club.

Community service & travel:

Community service overnight trips have been on hold until this academic year of 2022-2023. Last year students were active in Heal the Bay, Friends of the L.A. River (FOLAR), Tree People and Sunrise. Our own Green Team actively works for better environmental habits and awareness on campus.

Performance:

Students are musically active, participating in one of two choirs, and high-school band.

Athletics:

Students are active in basketball, volleyball, and soccer, competing against other schools in the California Interscholastic Federation Southern Section (CIF-SS) International League.

Class of 2022

34 students formed the Class of 2022.

Post high school placement:

56% of students received **40** acceptances from Top 100 Global universities (US News & World Report).

85% are attending university, 12% are enrolled in community colleges, and 3% are attending a music certification program. Of students enrolled in a university, college, or other institution, 18 are in the USA, 11 are in Canada, 2 are in France, and 2 are in the Netherlands.
